Number + draw one detail

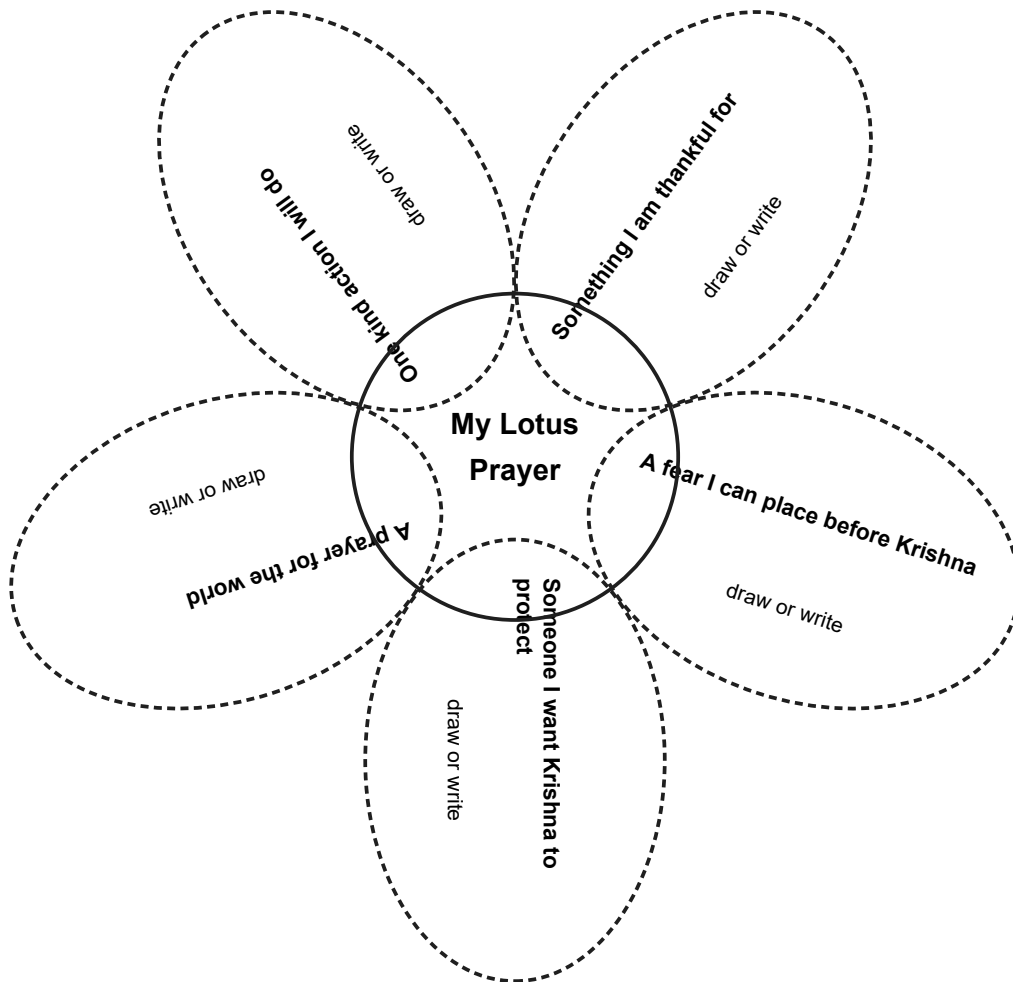
My Lotus Prayer
