

Put the cart pastime in order

Baby Kṛṣṇa Breaks the Cart | 18 minutes

Story connection

Baby Kṛṣṇa lies under a cart; the cowherd boys and Yaśodā are nearby when He kicks and breaks the cart yoke (Krishna Book Ch.7).

- The seven cards are shuffled on purpose.
- Number them in true story order.



Kṛṣṇa kicks upward and the cart yoke breaks.

Baby Kṛṣṇa rests under the cart after feeding.

Yaśodā rushes back and lifts her child with wonder.

Number + draw one detail



Yaśodā places Him there and turns to household work.

Number + draw one detail



The cowherd community praises the Lord's astonishing play.

Number + draw one detail



Cowherd boys play near the cart wheels.

Number + draw one detail
