

Put the twin-tree pastime in order

The Deliverance of Nalakūvara and Maṇigrīva | 20 minutes

Story connection

Bound as Dāmodara, Kṛṣṇa uproots the twin Yamala-arjuna trees; Nārada's curse on Nalakūvara and Maṇigrīva ends as the princes are liberated (Krishna Book / Nalakūvara and Maṇigrīva pastime).

- Number the eight shuffled cards in story order.
- Draw one calm detail on each card.



From the fallen trees, two radiant princes appear.

Number + draw one detail



Kṛṣṇa crawls between the twin Yamala-arjuna trees.

Number + draw one detail



Kṛṣṇa blesses them; they return toward their rightful place.

The mortar and rope catch between the trunks.

Number + draw one detail



Vraja gathers in wonder at the fallen twin trees.

Kṛṣṇa pulls and the twin trees begin to fall.
