Kṛṣṇa Protects Everyone from the Aghāsura Demon | 20 minutes

Story connection

Aghāsura appears as a huge snake; the cowherd boys enter his mouth thinking it a cave; Kṛṣṇa enters and saves all His friends (Krishna Book / Aghāsura pastime).
