

Food and devotion sequence

Delivering the Wives of the Brahmanas Who Performed Sacrifices | 18 minutes

Story connection

Krishna Book Ch.23: Hungry cowherd boys; brāhmaṇas refuse the first request; devoted wives bring food; Krishna sends them home; boys eat; brāhmaṇas later repent. Contrast sincere devotion with ritual pride—respectfully.

- Number the seven cards in true order.
- Underline where the wives bring food in devotion.



The brāhmaṇas' wives joyfully bring food despite relatives' resistance.

Number + draw one detail



The cowherd boys grow hungry in the forest and ask Krishna for help.

Number + draw one detail



The boys happily eat the food offered in devotion.

Number + draw one detail



The brāhmaṇas refuse and give no reply—busy with ritual.

Number + draw one detail



Later the brāhmaṇas repent for missing the chance to serve Krishna.

Number + draw one detail



Krishna sends them to ask the sacrificing brāhmaṇas for food.

Number + draw one detail



Krishna meets them kindly and sends them home to their duties.
